

## John Fetherstonhaugh HERRING

John Fetherstonhaugh Herring, was the brother of Chief Justice Sir Edmund Herring of the Supreme Court of Victoria, their father was Edmund Selwyn Herring a solicitor at Maryborough.

John Herring was born in 1889, and like his father and brother, he was educated at Melbourne Grammar. He completed his law degree at Melbourne University and was admitted to practice in May 1914.

He enlisted in January 1916 in the Australian Army Services Corps as a driver with the Motor Transport Unit. He left Australia in November 1916 and saw service in both England and France mainly as a driver.

He also worked with the pay corps and by the end of the War was working in the Records section. Made a sergeant, in May 1919, Herring returned to Australia in July 1919.

During his time with the Records Section in London, he shared accommodation with his two brothers at Lancaster Gate.

Instead of joining his father in practice in Maryborough, John Herring went into practice in Mildura in 1919 with Mr A. Crothers. This was only for a short duration as he had returned to Maryborough and joined his father's practice, by 1922. The firm his father helped start continues today at Maryborough, as Herring and Mcmillan. John Herring died in May 1968.
