

## David Bruce TUNNOCK

---

David Tunnock was 22 years of age, when he enlisted in 1915; he was still completing his articles with his father's firm at Nurmukah.

Originally placed with the Casualty Clearing Station Corps at Seymour, Tunnock embarked on 18 January 1916 on board the HMAT *Vestalia*. He had a brief stint in the 5<sup>th</sup> Field Ambulance but within a few weeks developed "neurasthenia" or nerves. He also developed influenza and after convalescing he was attached to the Pay Corps offices in France, England and Belgium. He was promoted to corporal and then sergeant for the trip home to Australia in 1919.

Admitted to practice on his return to Australia, Tunnock became a partner in D.Bruce Tunnock & Clarke solicitors in Queen street Melbourne.
