

## John TURNBULL

---

John Turnbull was 36 and a partner in the legal firm Blake & Riggall when he left Australia in 1915 to obtain a commission in the British Army. Turnbull had studied at Geelong Grammar and then completed a Master of Laws at Melbourne University. He was admitted to practice in 1902.

Turnbull rose to the level of major in the British Army and was twice wounded in action. He returned to Australia after the War and eventually became senior partner at Blake and Riggall. He also served on the Geelong Grammar School Council, was a trustee of the Children's Hospital and the honorary secretary of the Baker Medical Research Institute.

John Turnbull died in March 1946.
