DO YOU KNOW MORE ABOUT THIS STORY?

We have been unable to trace service records for Reginald Wilmoth.

There is a one page entry beside his name in the National Australian Archive service records, that suggest he certainly tried to enlist, but the Australian War Memorial embarkation and returning lists do not contain his name.

We do know he was born in February 1881 making him 31 in 1914. He completed his law degree at Melbourne University and was admitted to practice in August 1904. He worked in Horsham as a lawyer after the war and was involved in municipal politics, being elected several times as Mayor of Horsham. His last entry on the electoral rolls was in 1954, so we believe he probably died in the mid 1950s.
